- The London Canal Museum, is situated in the King's Cross area of London, England, beside Battlebridge Basin on the Regent's Canal. While the museum was only opened in 1992, the construction of the building dates to the 1860s, when it was in use as a warehouse for ice imported from Norway by ship and canal barge. There are two preserved ice wells under the building, one of which may be viewed from the public area of the museum. The import of ice responded generally for rising demand in Victorian England, but was also the specific entrepreneurial feat of Carlo Gatti, a Swiss-Italian immigrant, famous for making ice cream.
